Inquest into tot killed by runaway car

AN inquest has opened into the death of a British toddler killed when the family car rolled on top of her.

Ellie Perkins' mother Caroline ran after the runaway vehicle but was unable to stop it.

The child died in hospital in the Virgin Islands on March 9, the day before her second birthday.

The family moved to the isles from Dummer, Hants, when Ellie's father Daniel, a lawyer, got a new job there two years ago.

Caroline's mother Jill Hale said: "The terrain is an accident waiting to happen. Everything is on a hill."

Ellie's body has been flown home and her funeral is expected to be held this week. The Basingstoke inquest was adjourned.

Toothpaste for children costs double

CHILDREN'S toothpaste is twice the price of adult versions, a study found.

The average supermarket price of ordinary toothpaste is £1.21 while children's is about £2.40. Colgate and Aquafresh kids' ranges are up to three times more.

Tubes that feature popular cartoon characters cost most of all. Colgate's Minions toothpaste cost £4 per 100ml - almost four times the brand's standard version.

Aquafresh said: "Children's milk teeth are 50 per cent thinner so children's toothpaste has low abrasivity."

But experts said children could use small amounts of adult toothpaste. The British Dental Health Foundation said: "Kids' toothpaste is a marketing gimmick."
