"For a man getting married 10 hours later, he was really eating a lot. He sent back for seconds of risotto, both times wiping his plate clean with chunks of bread. I gave him mint and chocolate ice creams.

The actor was so pleased with the food he went into the kitchen and kissed thrilled cook, Giorgina Mazzero. She can now boast she was the last woman known to enjoy a clinch with George before his marriage.

The day after the feast in September, the star squeezed into his suave Armani tux to marry British lawyer Amal Alamuddin, 36.
