

## JAILED Harriet Rowe Carer's theft left OAP on bread & jam

A CARER who stole £7,500 of a pensioner's savings has been jailed for 14 months.

Harriet Rowe, 24, took up to £500 a day from her client's account via ATMs while he lived on bread and jam, a court heard.

She had been told by her employer, Caremark, to take extra care of the man, in his early 80s, who had been conned before.

But Rowe, of Bridlington, East Yorks, spent his money on make-up, petrol, cigarettes and lingerie, and still visited him after being moved to other duties.

The victim has since died from health problems unrelated to the case.

Judge David Tremberg told Rowe, who had earlier theft convictions, that her crimes "represent a serious escalation in the gravity of your offending".



## JAIL HMP Wakefield Rapist with 11 child victims dies in prison

A CHILD rapist whose crimes spanned 50 years has died in custody.


William Treadwell, 81, was jailed for life in May 2001 for eight counts of indecent assault on a male, and five on a female.

He was also convicted for three serious sex assaults, one rape and one count of gross indecency with a child.

There were 11 victims and the offences ran from the 1950s until 2001. All the victims were children.

In 2003, Treadwell failed in a bid to get his sentence cut. Lord Justice Scott Barker said: "His offences were appalling."

He died in hospital after being transferred from HMP Wakefield, North Yorks. A prison service spokesman said: "William Treadwell died on July 4."

# Teacher sacked after shelf stacking warning to pupils

**A ROOKIE teacher was sacked after warning a nine-year-old lad he would "end up stacking shelves" if he did not focus.**

Steven Walker also shouted at his class and punished two pupils by making them face the wall.

And during a game of dare called "girl touch" he told boys: "It won't be long before you will want girls touching you all of the time."

He was suspended weeks into his church school job, then sacked

for inappropriate behaviour. A disciplinary hearing heard the former musician told a Year 5 boy he "would end up stacking shelves or making packing boxes" if he couldn't do basic maths.

Mr Walker, 32, joined Queen Eleanor's C of E School in Guildford, Surrey, late in September 2017 after a bout of septic arth-

ritis. But he was cleared of serious misconduct when a Teaching Regulation Agency panel ruled his conduct, while inappropriate, had been "forgivable and explainable".

Mr Walker, from Sunderland, hopes to return to teaching. He said later he had been on "heavy-duty antibiotics" at the time and added: "It was stressful. I made

some errors. I ought to have picked my words more wisely. I'm a decent and honest bloke who's lost almost two years of his life because he made a mistake."

The Good Shepherd Trust, for the school, said the allegations of fact against Mr Walker had been found proved and were a breach of official teachers' standards. It expected its staff to be committed to "safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children".
